A COMMITMENT TO PET HEALTH

We commit to providing each animal with the veterinary care and treatment they need to be healthy and happy, before finding their new family. From routine spay/neuter surgery, to extensive dental procedures. Weight loss plans, intestinal obstructions, torn ligaments and more; we see incredibly complex cases and concerns come through our doors.

SPOTLIGHT ON GUS: Arriving to us at nearly 140 pounds in October of 2018, Gus spent nine weeks in our care to help get him on a healthy track to adoption. On adoption day Gus weighedin at 116, and was all smiles heading home with his new family.





THE NEXT GENERATION OF ANIMAL ADVOCATES

Our humane education department teaches kindness and compassion towards animals to 10,000 students annually.

Students ranging in age from toddler to college are learning how to be responsible for pets, how to read their body language, how humans make an impact on their wellbeing, and how we show them respect and kindness. Through humane education programming, we are cultivating a community of youth ambassadors and advocates.

FUN FACTS: Our humane education lessons are hands-on! The shelter is the classroom for kids, meeting a variety of animal species, ages and breed and learning how to nurture our human/animal bond.



OUR LIFE-SAVING SAFETY NET

We know that collaboration is the key to saving lives.

The ARLGP Safety Net stretches thousands of miles throughout our home state, region and country, working with more than 60 rescue and shelter partners.

Why? In other regions of the country, shelters have more animals than they have adopters for them. The ARLGP Safety Net is a network of collaboration that helps these shelters move adoptable animals to the ARLGP to find loving homes in Maine. These partnerships reduce the burden of overcrowded kennels and foster homes where they come from. We pay particular attention to welcome senior and special needs animals, knowing that their chances in an overburdened shelter are slim. Thanks to you, they are welcomed here with open arms.

LIFE-SAVING STATS: In 2018 we welcomed 752 pets from Maine partners and nearly 1,800 pets from national partners.
